O CA00002 Tower Clock	An unusual and novel device is this "Solar Post Clock" which is located in front of Jacobs & Sons Jewelers at 7th & "B" Streets in downtown San Diego. This is supposedly the first solar powered clock to be installed in San Diego. It was a gift to Chris Jacobs from the Seiko company in 1983, and Chris had it installed. The solar collector can be seen at the top of the clock. The head is approx 24" in dia. & is mounted on a post which is approximately 20' tall. It has a very accurate time-only quartz movement and runs on a solar powered battery system that theoretically can run for 90 days without sunshine (there's very little likelihood that such a sunless period would ever occur in San Diego!). O CA00004 Street Clock	A post clock in front of the "Parkhouse Eatery", 4574 Park Blvd. in the Univ. Heights area of San Diego (CA). Information about this clock was obtained from its present owner who lives in Mexico, and the ownership was traced back to a well-known San Diego realtor--Art Leitch. The present owner purchased it about 1977 for his antique store, which preceded the restaurant, from a jeweler who in turn obtained it from realtor Art Leitch, who had it built. I talked to Art, who is 87 years old, but his memory is fading and he doesn't remember much about the clock. Art's family and the manager of his Real Estate office could not offer any help. In research, at the San Diego Historical Society archives, I found that the location of Art Leitch's offices during the '50s was adjacent to the jeweler from whom the clock was purchased and was the location from which the clock was moved by the present owner. That pretty well dates the clock. O CA00005 Street Clock	A larger relatively new Street clock is located at Adams Avenue & Ohio Street in the "Normal Heights" (or Adams Avenue antique row) area of San Diego (CA). This nearly 16-ft tall Timeonly clock was made by the Verdin co. of Cincinnati Ohio. It was installed in 1990 and is owned by the Adams Ave Business association. The 4 dials have arabic numerals; it's electricly powered; and has a photo cell to automatically control back lighting. The post of the clock weighs 245 lbs and the clock head weighs 532 lbs. The Plaza is named for it's donor Helen Copley, publisher of the San Diego Union-Tribune. The 12-ft Time-only clock was made by the Verdin co. of Cincinnati Ohio and installed in 1993. O CA00010 Street Clock 	A nice 4-dial Street clock is located in the "Park Plaza shopping Center" Chula vista (CA), at the corner of 3rd & F streets. It was built in 1984 by "Canterbury Designs" of Sherman Oaks CA, for the "Redevelopment Agency" of the City of Chula vista. It is 16 1/2 ft tall with four 30-in dia dials. It contains a Maas-Rowe Carillon which has the capability of chiming on the hour with a preamble and optionally: chiming on the half-hour; playing any of many melodies on the hour. O CA00011 Street Clock	A clock in Bern switzerland was the inspiration for this wonderful clock, constructed in 1907. It is 22' tall and although it has a time-only movement it is complicated in that it has over 300 moving parts and 20 dials: 16 of which are in the head--a large dial on each of it's 4 faces, as well as 12 auxiliary dials which tell time of principal cities of the world, as shown in the photo. The movement has 4 additional dials (in the base of the clock) indicating hours, minutes, seconds, month, date and day of the week. The movement has a gravity escapement and contains 17-jewels made with native San Diego (CA) stones of Tourmaline, Topaz, Jade and Agate from the Jessop mine on Mount Palomar (CA) and cut in their own shop. Every part of the intricate mechanism was designed and made by hand in the Jessop shop. It is claimed to be the most completely jeweled and the finest street clock in America, and the first clock of its kind ever built in a retail jewelry store. The pendulum bob weighs 55 lbs. The motive power is a weight which is wound automatically by an electric motor every 8 hours. [The weight was originally 200-1b but later changed to 100 lb.] The head weighs 1,000 lb. The clock took 15 months to build, was exhibited at the State Fair in Sacramento (CA) in 1907, and awarded a gold medal. The clock's weight system extends into a vault which is 12' below the street level. The clock has been relocated within San Diego (CA) several times. At the time the clock was built, J. Jessop and Sons Jewelers was located at 952 5th ave. In 1927 the store was relocated to 1041 5th and the clock was relocated also. The most recent move was to Horton Plaza shopping center, do wntown, in 1984. The clock is still owned by the Jessop family of San Diego. The clock has been overhauled only twice: first in 1948; the second, prior to its move to Horton plaza in 1985, averaging about 40 years between overhauls.			4th and Broadway, San Diego, SD County, CA 92112



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	The estimated replacement cost of the clock is \$2,000,000 and it's insured for \$1,000,000. Found two references to the clock stopping--- a) The 1st, from a July-Aug 1948 article in a Union Title & Trust company [bank] newsletter [found in the San Diego public library]- "The Jessops tell us the big clock has stopped running only twice. Once when an earthquake caused the intricate works to malfunction, and another time when the wagon tongue of a runaway vehicle rammed through the mechanism. On another occasion, the framework of the timepiece caught fire, but the big clock placidly continued to tick." b) The 2nd reference, from a San Diego History book [page 64], San Diego public library- "Claude D. Ledger, one of the principle builders of the clock died in 1935. The clock stopped; it was restarted, but stopped again three days later--the day of his funeral. This curious incident was reported in Ripley's "Believe it or Not...]

A unique Tower Clock is located in the Metropolitan Transportation Center at 12th & Imperial streets in downtown San Diego (CA). The center has a storage yard for their rolling stock which includes: San Diego transit system busses; San Diego trolley cars; as well as the "Coaster" (a commuter train that runs between Oceanside and San Diego).

A free-standing 233 ft tower which contains the clock mechanism (a master & 4 slave timepieces and a digital programmable chime/strike system). The Swiss Bank corporation which worked with the County of San Diego and the Metropolitan Transit Development Board, arranged for the donation of the clock from "Ebel Watchmaker co." of switzerland [it was not made by Ebel.] It was presented as a gift to the people of the City of San Diego and has been valued in excess of \$700,000. The tower was built in 1988 and the clock installed later that year.

The clock has four-dials, with red Roman numerals, a white face and 6-foot long red hands. The mechanism was shipped unassembled to San Diego from switzerland in a jumbo jet. It took 12 days for Swiss technicians to put the system together. Several boxes and crates containing the slave movements had to be handcarried up the 15 stories of the tower (there is NO elevator or stairways, only ship's ladders).

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O CA00013 Tower Clock	Then the parts for each movement were assembled and placed through a small hole in the center of the dial at the top of the tower. The holes weren't wide enough to use a crane. There was a scaffold system outside to assist in installing the clocks. The 4 movements are controlled by a master clock system located on the second level of the tower and is battery-operated in the event of a power failure. The clock system has electronic speakers; is capable of Westminster chimes, hr & 1/2 hr strike, The Angelus, Mass, individual ball-peals, and music via a compact-disc; also has powerful back lighting so it can be seen at night. There originally was a scheme to synchronize time-keeping with signals relayed from Switzerland to Denver Colorado via satellite, then by microwave transmission to the tower, however this scheme was never implemented.			
	The clock, with 5 foot tall movement, was manufactured by the Seth-Thomas Company of Thomaston Connecticut in 1890; purchased by the county for \$420; and installed in the San Diego County courthouse in 1890. A local jeweler M. German, maintained and regulated this clock for \$100 yearly. The two-ton bell attached to this clock was silenced in 1919 because it disturbed court trials and nearby hotel residents. In addition, it's ringing resembled the town fire bell and caused many false alarms. In 1939 the bell and movement were removed because it feared they might fall into the courtrooms below. The bell placed on loan to mission San Luis Rey (in Oceanside, CA), and movement crated and placed in storage until 1979 when it restored by Chapter 59. Since the pendulum & weight for the movement were missing, replacements were fabricated by members of Chapter 59. Only the time train is operational, and was modified to allow automatic rewinding of the weight with an electric motor. The restored movement was rededicated to Public Service on May 14, 1981 housed in a customized glass-enclosed case (for protection while permitting the operating movement to be viewed from 3 sides) with 3 (smaller than the 5 foot dia original) dials above the movement in a simulated tower structure. This display is located in the lobby of the present courthouse, 222 W. Broadway,

O CO00006 Tower Clock 	The E. Howard serial number list unfortunately stops around the early 1900's and does not include your clock. I did find some information pertaining to your clock and building. The building was designed by a Colorado native named George Hebard Williamson and was designed to resemble Independence Hall in Philadelphia Pennsylvania. I had seen some photographs of your building and Independence Hall and the similarities are striking. Colorado Chapter #21 has undertaken a project to restore the four dial E. Howard Tower Clock (serial number 3728) at the East High School in Denver, Colorado. We are attempting to learn something about the clock as there does not seem to be much "corporate" historical knowledge about its acquisition and installation. 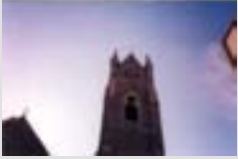

About 1 year prior to this visit, vandals did extensive damage to the mechanism, but the electrically modified clock was restored. Maintenance is an issue with the town and some local people initiated a program to replace the old clock. David Booth, a clock repair resident of Westminster, and a NAWCC member called attention to the threat which he read in the newspaper, and the chapter 11 delegation visited the clock to better understand the situation. The clock, originally installed in 1896, was converted to an electric drive system approximately 30 years ago. While the pendulum is still intact, and some disassembled parts, like the fly, are still in the tower, it is probably not reasonable to attempt a full restoration to the original mechanical state. David Booth thought he was capable of doing the necessary repairs for the city, and indicated he would approach the city government on that basis. Chuck Roeser has been involved with the clock in the past, and made the repairs after the vandalism, has been in contact with David recently, and would be David's backup if he feels he needs help. Clock Description The clock is located in a tower which was added to the 1879 fire house. It was a gift in 1896 according to a plaque in the 1st floor entry to the tower. Access is up to a 2nd floor by stairs, up a 2nd flight to an attic, through a roof hatch and then out onto the old fire house flat roof. Inside the tower at the roof level, but open to weather, is the bell. By ladder, access is gained to the enclosed clock room above the bell. The 4, 4' diameter dials are above the clock, but driven by a drive system inside the clock room. The clock is a Seth Thomas. The name plate is dated May 16, 1896, and it is clock #897, and marked "A. S. Hotchkiss". It is a 1 second pendulum. The bed dimensions are: 30.5"L X 23"W X 35"H. The frame above the bed is 21"H. Pendulum length from spring to bottom of the pendulum is 48", and the cylindrical bob is approximately 5" in diameter and 14" long (not measured). The model # was unidentified and is not indicated on the name plate. Chuck Roeser indicated it a #16, after the visit. The bell was cast by J. Resister & Sons, Baltimore, MD, and measures 37" in diameter at the mouth. Again according to the 1923 ST catalog, that would be an 1100# bell. It is inscribed "Westminster Fire Engine & Hose #1, Incorporated 1879" (date on 1st building as well). The other side has several names of officials on an 1881 executive committee. The small electric motor now driving the time side was made by Bodine Electric Co., Chicago. It is a 1/125th HP, 1800 RPM, 180:1 gear reduction unit. The troublesome switches are reported to be older mercury switches. Photographs were taken.

	Jewelry store, in 1977. Before then, it stood for more than 60 years in Monessan, PA. The clock was originally owed by H.P. Brown, whose son, Benjamin, invented and manufactured it. The clock inspired a business of street clocks known as Brown's Street Clocks. the company sold five models of street clocks, with its biggest standing at more than 14 feet high and weighing more than 1,600 pounds. T.Z. Thomas, the man who sold the clock to Wallace in 1977, was the second owner of the clock. Thomas, a watchmaker, opened a jewelry store in Monessan, where the clock stood and eventually bought it from Brown. Wallace said he showed an interest in purchasing a street clock and with help from a patron at his store, was introduced to Thomas. I went down there with one of my friends, Duke Dunn and we bought it back on a snowmobile trailer," Wallace said. Wallace said he is at a time in his life when it would be difficult to use the clock at his store again but is glad it will be in use again for people to enjoy. "I am happy it is going somewhere else. It will be an asset to the train depot," Wallace said. Phelps said the clock almost didn't make it's way to Remsen. The clock was originally guaranteed to a friend of Wallace's from Buffalo, but the transaction fell through. Phelps said when he orginally inquired about the clock it was spoken for, but he left his name and number with Wallace anyway. When the Buffalo buyer was not able to take the clock, Wallace remembered Phelps. Wallace told Phelps as long as he can do the work and guarantee to put it up, he could have it. 	and the wiring was very deteriorated. To add to its indignity the clock was also found to be the home of a large population of hornets. The clock and chimes are controlled by a key wound Seth Thomas pendulum master clock located in the former president's office of the bank, now the library directors office. The secondary outside clock and chimes were originally powered by a bank of batteries, but now will be powered by electricity. Spearheading the effort to restore this clock was Hans Sendlakowski, husband of one of the library's board members. "When my wife became a board member I was curious about the clock since I grew up listening to its chimes, said Mr. Sendlakowski, and I wondered whether it would be possible to get it going again". "After examining the master clock and figuring out how it worked and determining that it wasn't in bad shape, I wondered what shape the secondary clocks were in. With the help of Mel Duggan and his crew we found out just how extensive the repairs were going to be". The clock was taken to Rick Yehl a local volunteer who spent much time welding and rebuilding the interior steel framework and reworking the doors so they would fit properly. His employer, Abbott Welding, donated the electrical wire which was needed to run from the master clock to the exterior clock, since the old cloth covered wire encased in lead sheathing was in bad shape. After the framework was reconstructed, the clock was brought to Mr. Sendlakowski's house where he rewired the chimes, had the electrical coils rebuilt, reinstalled them, had the clock mechanisms rebuilt and reinstalled, and fixed the stained glass. Shirtheads and the Allegany Citizen donated their expertise and relettered the Library signs for the clock and volunteer Richard Straub helped rewire the electrical lights for the clock and helped run the new control wire to the clock. . The top and bottom copper covers were resoldered by James Billings of Billing's Sheet metal. Mr. Duggan supplied the truck and crew to put the clock back up. The copper exterior was not polished to its original bright color since it was felt that after being in the outdoors for over eighty years it had earned its green patina "This couldn't have been accomplished without the full cooperation and input of the Library Board or its Library director Nate Austin who put up with a lot of visits and inconvenience. Also donations were received from members of the community to help defray the cost of the rebuild. We didn't do it for any acclaims but rather to see a bit of history restored to our Village and to have our children enjoy it as we did" said Mr. Sendlakowski.

O TX00001 Tower Clock	 The Walls Unit of the Texas Prison system is located in the city of Huntsville. To my knowledge, it is the only state prison in the US that has a functioning tower clock. For some 30 years, I traveled the 8 southwestern states of the US for USDA. After learning of this clock, I visited this prison. I took my camera and my NAWCC membership card and and walked into the prision office. I was able to convince the Warden that I should be permitted to take pictures of the clock. A Major of the prison guards was assigned to escort me. We went up into the "attic" of the main building where I examined the Seth Thomas tower clock movement and took pictures. We then went through the security doors into the prison "yard". I went up the stairs to the landing where Carrasco and his two cohorts made the attempted escape and took a picture of the clock dial that faces the "Yard." According to the Texas Prison Museum, the clock was originally installed in the late 1890's in a tower of the then existing prison building. It had four dials. That building was renovated in 1942 and the clock was reinstalled in the remodeled bulding but with only 2 dials. Unless you have been a prison employee or an inmate of the Walls Unit, you would not get to see the dial of the clock facing the "yard". Fred Gomez Carrasco, a convicted drug lord from the San AntonioTexas area was imprisoned at the Walls Unit Texas State Prison in Huntsville, Texas. He and two other inmates took over the prision library. On Friday, August 2, 1974, one of the hostages was released to inform officials of his escape plans. The inmates constructed a movable shield of chalk boards, peg board, and library books to get them safely from the second floor library to the waiting armored car. The next day, Texas Ranger Captains Pete Rogers and G. W. Burks led the attempt to intercept Carrasco's "Trojan horse." When the escape vehicle stalled while turning a corner on the entrance ramp, the assault team demanded surrender, then turned fire hoses on the escape vehicle. Inmates opened fire which was answered by the assault team. When the gunfire ceased, Carrasco lay dead of a self-inflicted gunshot. The picture of the clock dial that faces the inside "yard" of the prision was taken from the second floor landing where Carrasco and his two hencemen exited the library.
